CALL TO ORDER:

Mayor Gahan called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

APPROVAL OR CORRECTION OF THE FOLLOWING MINUTES:

Mr. Grimes moved to approve the April 27, 2023 Regular Meeting Minutes, Mr. Wilkinson second, all voted in favor.

BIDS/CONTRACTS:

1. Mike Wallace re: Prosser Pump #2 Repair Quote

Mr. Wallace presented a quote from Xylem to repair pump #2 at the Prosser Lift Station. He explained that this was found during the bi-annual inspection and the quote is for \$14,703.04

Mr. Wilkinson moved to approve, Mr. Grimes second, all voted in favor.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Evan Thie, NAHA re: Final Plat Approval for Beechwood Court Redevelopment

Ms. Samantha Thompson, HWC, presented a plat for Beechwood Court Redevelopment to be approved by the board. She stated that as far as she knows they are keeping an existing sanitary line that runs north-south right through the middle of the site, and adding new lines to service the rest of the buildings.

Mr. Summers stated that he reviewed this when it came through the plan commission and has since spoken with the planning and zoning department, and according to them all of the rights-of-way are in accordance to what the development is going to be like. He added that at any of the locations where there was a vacation of the previous right-of-way and existing infrastructure, they did put in easements to account for it. He stated that everything looks to be in order to move forward.

- Mr. Wallace stated that they reviewed the capacity study so they are good to go on that end.
- Mr. Grimes asked Ms. Thompson if she had a plat for them to sign.
- Ms. Thompson replied no.

Mr. Summers stated that there was a typo on the mylar so once that is corrected they will bring the plat back.

Mr. Grimes moved to approve with the stipulation that they will sign the plat when they get the corrections made and brought back, Mr. Wilkinson second, all voted in favor.

COMMUNICATIONS - PUBLIC:

Mr. Darrell Neeley stated that he wanted to give a shout-out to storm water and explained that they had an issue at the VFW with the creek running on Grant Line that flooded them out twice this year, forcing them to close down. He added that since the work has been done, they haven't had any real issues, but this year they did have some big rains so it came up again and got in the building that caused them to shut down again. He stated that he brought it up to storm water at a meeting and wanted to give them kudos for coming out same day and addressing the issue within a week. He added that everyone at the VFW appreciates the work they did.

Mayor Gahan thanked him for coming in and bring the issue to their attention because a lot of times when issues come up, they don't get a call to address it.

Mr. Neeley stated that he saw them working this morning on beautifying the area for Memorial Day and he appreciates that as well.
